Thelma from her family, and refused to let her work. She was a prisoner in her own home. She realized that no matter how hard she tried, she could not be the perfect wife Eugene wanted. She desired to leave so many times, but had no friends, no money, and no way to support herself and her four children. So, she remained, hoping that once the children were grown, she would find a way to escape.

After 30 years, Thelma still feels trapped, but has learned how to walk on eggshells to minimize the abuse. She thought she could live with the abuse - the slapping, the punching, the name calling, and the repeated threats to kill her or her beloved pet. She saw no hope for escape. Then one day, Eugene escalated to a new level of violence. He chased her with a knife, caught her, grabbed her by the throat, threatened to kill her and then raped her. Thelma knew then that she had no hope but to

flee. That night, she waited for Eugene to fall asleep, and then she ran to a nearby convenience store and called the Clay County Quigley House 24-hour hotline. Thelma moved into the shelter, obtained an injunction for protection, and is now in the process of starting her new life, free of violence.

Eugene was never arrested, because like many battered women, Thelma never called the police, fearing that doing so would just make Eugene angrier. Eugene is currently in a batterer's intervention program, however, that was court ordered through the injunction for protection.

Although Thelma's story is real, it is not unusual. Most of us have heard stories such as this and many of us know of someone who has experienced such abuse. Yet, we don't talk about it - perhaps because we hope that such incidents of abuse of our nation's most vulnerable are few and far between.

FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic Violence is abuse committed by a spouse, a former spouse, a fiancée, a boyfriend or girlfriend, and a cohabitant upon another individual. It is estimated that a domestic violence act occurs every 15 seconds somewhere in the United States. That figure translates to over 2.5 million victims per year. This abuse affects the lives of the victim and the families who live within the boundaries of these abusive relationships.

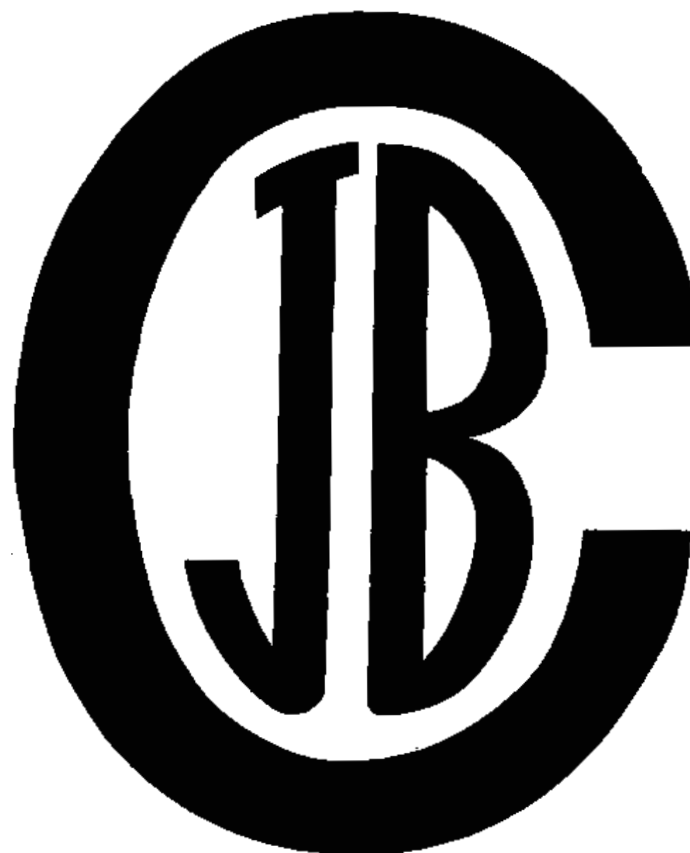
