ally, victims of trafficking come from diverse demographic, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds and have different trafficking histories that require individualized, culturally sensitive, and linguistically appropriate service provision.

Who are the traffickers?

Traffickers wear many different faces including the following: members of organized criminal networks, freelancers, relatives, neighbors, friends, village chiefs, community leaders, shop owners, employers, diplomats, and agri-

cultural business operatives. Traffickers use threats, intimidation, and violence, as well as deception and trickery, to force or lure victims to engage in commercial sex acts, services, or labor under slavery-like conditions.

Difference between smuggling and trafficking?

Smuggling involves the illegal movement of consenting people across a national border for financial or material remuneration. The relationship between the smuggler and the migrant generally ends upon

arrival at their destination.

Trafficking, on the other hand, involves the ongoing exploitation of victims who are forced to work against their will. Victims of trafficking either never consented or their initial consent is considered "irrelevant" due to the coercive, deceptive, or abusive actions of the traffickers. Whereas smuggling invariably entails the crossing of a national border, trafficking can also occur internally and affect U.S. citizens who are held in slavery-like conditions.
