implemented. Safety is a main concern, along with preservation of forensic information.

It takes a great deal of education of both K-9 and handler to understand the conditions causing the odor and determine its location. Training, research and learning in this field is continuous. It takes the cooperation from a host of experts – mostly in fields not related to K-9 – to make human detection efforts successful. Many of these experts only know a dog has a tail and may bite. Medical examiners, anthropologists, entomologists, botanists, pathologists and other human remains detector dog handlers have played a role in the learning process. In-house resources are also invaluable, including the Homicide Unit, Crime Scene Investigation Unit, Marine Patrol and the Underwater Recovery Unit.

Work dogs have been, and always will be, one of the best tools in law enforcement. They are not miracle workers, but used properly and responsibly, they can help an investigation. Locating human remains or clearing an area with a good degree of certainty is important for an investigation to move to the next level. It is our responsibility as trainers and handlers to present capable K-9 teams to work in a

responsible manner.

So the next time you are watching a K-9 perform, whether it is on television or in person, think about all the training that went into both the dog and the handler. Try to decipher how the odor is actually driving that K-9's behavior. This will give you even greater insight into what has been one of the most important jobs in solving crimes in South Florida: Human Remains Detection.
