... to JSO School Resource Officer Samuel Rodriguez who spends much of his off-duty time teaching survival skills to citizens of all ages. He goes to churches, libraries, businesses – anywhere he is invited – to share his expertise in helping people fend off attackers. Having earned a black belt in traditional Japanese-style jujitsu, he says simple common sense is the best self defense.

Rodriguez emphasizes the importance of always being aware of one's surroundings; watch for unusual movements or attention from people nearby. Keep keys or a credit card in your hand; use common items as weapons. He demonstrates how easily a credit card can slice like a knife blade through a sheet of paper – and thus through flesh or an eyeball. Basically, he teaches folks – young and old – how to temporarily distract or incapacitate an attacker long enough to escape.

A former NYPD officer, Rodriguez has lived in Jacksonville and been with JSO since 1990. He worked on patrol in Zone 5 about nine years, was with the DARE program several years and now is an SRO at DuPont Middle School. His supervisor, Lt. Joe Medlin, says he "does an outstanding job."

Our hats are off to Sam Rodriguez for doing his part to make Jacksonville's citizens safer.
