

We Need Your Help JSO Cold Case Files

On 01-14-95, at approximately 0111 hours, the victim (Samuel Scott, b/m, 12-10-60, 8231 Princeton Square Boulevard) was found inside his vehicle (1990 Honda / Maroon colored, two (2) door) on I-95 South, south of Ashley Street. Investigation revealed that the victim was shot while traveling west bound on Ashley Street. After the shooting, the victim crashed his vehicle into a retaining wall on the west side of I-95. The victim was transported to University Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. JSO Patrol Officers who responded to the crash actually heard several shots fired in the area prior to the crash being reported. The victim's vehicle sustained extensive damage from bullet strikes. Subsequent Investigation

revealed that the victim was employed at AT&T where he had worked for eleven (11) years. The victim was also known to frequent the restaurant "Calico Jacks" located at 9551 Baymeadows Road.

Per Detective R.S. McKean, Homicide / Cold Case Unit, there is very little information to release about the investigation. A review of the case revealed that there were no witnesses to the actual shooting and only a limited amount of evidence was recovered from the scene. The victim's vehicle was processed by FDLE and the projectiles recovered from inside were submitted and processed. The results did not produce any viable suspect information. The original lead detectives conducted numerous interviews throughout



the investigation; however, specific details as to the identity of the suspect(s) were not obtained. As a result, there is no suspect description available.

Arson Suspect

On December 7, 2009, this subject entered the BP Station located at 1628 3rd Street North at approximately 1502 hours, calmly asked the employee for the restroom key and went to the restroom located on the outside of the building. He returned the key and left on foot northbound from the business. After a short time, the employee realized the restroom was on fire and was able to extinguish it. The subject used the paper towel dispenser to ignite the fire. There were also racially motivated remarks written on the

walls inside the restroom. On December 8, 2009, an incident was reported at 810 20th Avenue North involving the same type of actions. At some point after 1700 hours on December 7, 2009, someone entered the men's locker room and wrote racially motivated remarks in the restroom area. A paper towel dispenser was also ignited, but did not develop further and damage was minimal. The writing on the walls matched the writing from the incident at 1628 3rd Street North.
