have changed what happened, because her son was murdered that night. She awakened Wednesday morning still not feeling well, and suddenly experienced a sensation she never had before. Then TV news reported a man had been found deceased in the front seat of a car at 1261 North Broad Street, and she started crying. She knew it was her son, even before friends called to tell her, or the police came to let her know.

Damien worked 10 years for Winn-Dixie and then remodeling houses. He loved his children, enjoyed taking them to the beach and spending time with them. ## Darryl Caldwell



Darryl Caldwell, 36, was sitting on the stairs of his Northwood Apartment on Dunn Ave. December 30, 2009, when he was accosted by a young black male wanting drugs and money. Darryl and a friend with him said "no" and got up to walk upstairs. The killer pulled a gun and told Darryl to give him everything in his pocket. When he said he had nothing but his cell phone, the man took it but still shot him. Darryl ran but collapsed, and was transported to Shands where he died.

## Roy Junior Youngblood III



On June 21, 2008, someone phoned Roy Youngblood and asked to meet him at 9 p.m. He left the house in a friend's car and didn't return. Friends kept calling his cell phone, but there was no response. Finally at 1:00 a.m. on June 22, a detective came to let the family know Roy had been found in the still-running car, slumped over the steering wheel. He had been shot multiple times.

Roy was a rap musician and a manager of Ruby Tuesday's in the Regency area. Police have no leads on a suspect for this murder. If you know anything about this case, please call Det. ## Linda Joyce Frazier



This 46-year-old woman had recently moved into a single apartment in the new part of Blodgett Homes on West 4th Street and by all accounts was doing very well. After a troubled life, she had been clean for more than a year and was regularly attending church.

No one knows what precipitated the events of March 5, 1995, but Linda Frazier was brutally assaulted, beaten in the head, left lying in a large pool of blood on her kitchen floor. The area had been ransacked and drug paraphernalia was scattered on the table. Neighbors heard slamming noises from the apartment and found her on the floor

when they checked on her. But her attacker had fled.

Transported to University Hospital (now Shands), she remained in a coma until she died on August 17, 1995. Ironically, her 17-year-old son Eugene was in the hospital with a work-related injury when she was brought to the emergency room - but he did not know she was there until later. He grieves for his mother and wants to see her case solved. Police closed the file for lack of suspect information.

## Joel Rodger Broadway II



A good-looking 19-year-old young man, Joel Broadway was a "free spirit" who lived with his girl friend and her parents. Working as a construction helper, he loved music and had recently purchased a guitar he wanted to learn to play. He loved boating, swimming and fishing - all the activities one enjoys living in Florida.

Joel went out with a friend on May 15, 1985, and never returned. On that date a construction worker, who was repairing a road near a wooded area in the 1300 block of Life Oak Drive (south of Atlantic Blvd.), stepped off his heavy equipment, walked into the woods and saw a cap lying near the edge of the road. He picked up the cap, looked into the wooded area and saw the body of a white male who had been beaten and strangled.

Joel's parents still miss their son, grieve for him and

would like nothing more than to see his murderer brought to justice. Joel left behind a daughter, now 25 and the mother of three children. She, too, wants to know what happened to her dad, and why.


