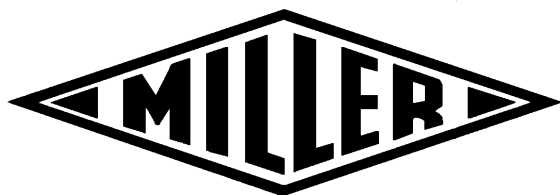

Hurricane Season

The fine Florida weather that we all appreciate is here and summer is fast approaching. Along with the sun and fun, however, comes something much more serious: hurricane season. Every year, people across Jacksonville have the potential to become victims of a hurricane.

The 2008 season officially starts on June 1, and now is the time to get prepared and ensure that you are not a victim of the destruction and

devastation that can come along with these powerful storms. As we've all learned in past years, one of the most important steps to preventing tragedy is having a plan in place should a natural disaster strike. I encourage each of you to understand the potential impact a major hurricane may have on our area and learn what to do during a disaster, how to make a plan, and where to get the latest information. Our emergency procedures can only operate effectively if residents are aware of them and know where to get help. And, of course, a family disaster plan is critical.

If you have not already done so, please take the time now to write down what you will do

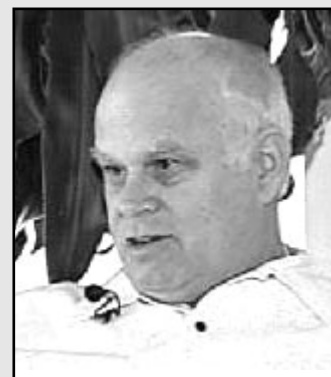
if our area is threatened by a natural disaster. Find out if your home can survive the storm. Determine whether or not you live in an evacuation zone and where you can go for safety. Assemble the supplies you will need and make a list of the places you can get the latest disaster information. Discuss these preparations with your family and agree on a plan to get in touch if you should become separated.

Now is the time to take responsibility for the safety of your household. You can visit the city's Web site at www.coj.net to determine whether or not you live in an evacuation zone and to learn other tips for creating a personal disaster response plan.

WE NEED YOUR HELP

Philanthropist and Jacksonville civic leader Danny Berenberg was struck by a hit-and-run driver the night of April 4, 2008, in Jacksonville Beach during the Blues Festival. The driver knew she hit someone, got out of her car, then returned to her vehicle and fled, leaving Danny semi-conscious in the street with life-threatening injuries. She is described as being in her late 20s or early 30s with shoulder-length sandy brown hair, about 5 feet, 2 inches tall, driving a beige or gray 1995-96 Pontiac Grand Prix-type vehicle with blotchy, sun-scalded paint. Something decorative hung from her rear-view mirror.
