JSO Expands Operation ID

Operation I.D. has always been an effective citizen burglary prevention program.

Now the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office is expanding it and encouraging more citizens to use it.

The Operation I.D. program involves marking of property with an identifying number as a means of discouraging burglary and theft.

The JSO, with support from Home Depot, Lowes and Sears, is making it easier for citizens to participate. Engraving equipment can be checked out for two days at all six JSO substations, as well as at the Police Memorial Building downtown.

After marking the property, police suggest making a list to keep in a safe place. If anything is stolen, it can be described and that will assist police in trying to recover it.

Police recommend engraving TV sets, stereo equipment, guns, radios, car tape decks, tape recorders, fishing rods and reels, vacuum cleaners, kitchen appliances, cameras, bicycles, golf clubs, power tools, etc. The secret word is harass.

The officer who responds to the call will interview the victim to determine whether the crime of stalking has been committed. In Florida, "stalking" is defined as "willfully, maliciously, and repeatedly" following or harassing another person.

Generally "stalking" is a first degree misdemeanor. If the stalker threatens the victim, or stalks the victim after an injunction has been issued, or the victim is under 16 years of age, the "stalking" becomes a felony.

If "stalking" has occurred and the suspect can be located, the officer may arrest the stalker. If the stalker cannot be located but can be identified, then the officer may obtain a warrant for the stalker's arrest. In some cases the victim may also be referred to the clerk's office to obtain an injunction.

protective order. While processing the injunction through the courts, Beatrice discovered her perpetrator had six other documented stalking and domestic violence incidences on six different women

Today, Beatrice feels guardedly more safe yet emotionally exhausted. Despite the court order, she remains constantly vigilant, always on watch and never letting her guard down. As far as she knows, her perpetrator has not attempted to

contact her.

In an effort to enforce the injunction to its full benefit and help avoid future contact, Beatrice finally informed her family and co-workers of the abuse she had endured for the last three years. To her surprise, the support she received was tremendous. Without hesitation, her employer placed tempered glass in the waiting room and a lock on the door that leads to the office where Beatrice works.

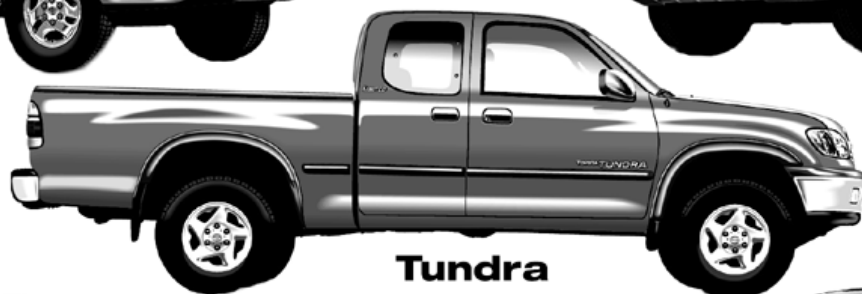
