Thursday night before the Super Bowl, JSO Officers James Brunett and Keith Nasworth were patrolling the St. Johns River when their boat ran into a support piling of the former Fuller Warren Bridge. Brunett was critically injured and is facing long-term recovery and extensive rehab. Nasworth was initially released but later re-hospitalized when more injuries were discovered. He is now recovering at home.

The Fraternal Order of Police is helping defray expenses for Brunett's mother and sister as they come from another state to be with their loved one during his devastating, probably life-altering experience. Rev. Garry Wiggins, a long-time Justice Coalition board member, has been co-pastor of the 5,000-member Evangel Temple A/G church for the past 23 years. His busy schedule, in addition to daily pastoral duties, includes participation in multiple community activities, most recently spearheading an outreach to help Jacksonville citizens during Super Bowl week. The Convoy of Hope, with the aid of 3,108 volunteers from 176 local churches and organizations, assisted 6,032 guests with food, clothing, medical and dental care, financial advice, free haircuts and many other services.

Thirteen years ago, Pastor Garry initiated Christian Professional's Resource to provide, at monthly luncheons, a networking opportunity for the business community. His church places a strong emphasis on world missions, and he leads teams several times a year to such locales as Central and South America (and last year China) to provide medical care, construct church buildings, conduct pastor's schools and evangelize.

Pastor Garry, who serves on many boards of other Christian-related organizations in Jacksonville, has also been involved in radio and television programs for more than 25 years. He is a graduate of Southeastern College and has an honorary Doctorate from Truth Bible College. He and his wife, Kim, have three children.

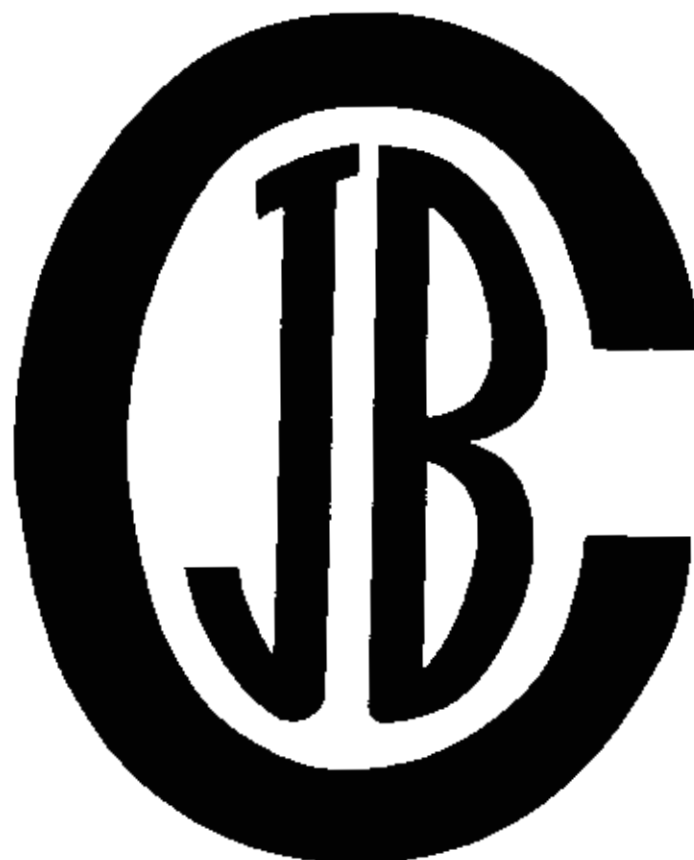
