ANN DUGGER SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Eligibility Criteria

Who may apply for this scholarship? Who is eligible?

- Innocent victims of violent crime or their family members who have been served by the Justice Coalition. The term “family” includes spouses, siblings, parents, children, grandparents, and grandchildren
- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- A bona fide resident of Baker, Bradford, Clay, Duval, Flagler, Nassau, Putnam or St. Johns County
- One who will use the scholarship to attend an accredited 2- or 4- year college or university
- Not eligible are Justice Coalition Board or Staff members, past or present, and their respective dependents, family members (parent, child, sibling and spouse) and individuals residing in their same household

What must the person do to apply?

- Complete the application that follows
- All applications must be postmarked or received no later than Monday, February 20, 2017, by 4:00 p.m.

How will the applications be evaluated?

- All applications will be reviewed and evaluated by current members of Justice Coalition, Inc., Board of Directors and Staff, with consideration being given to:
 - Character
 - Financial need
 - Statement of educational goals and career objectives

How will the winner be announced?

- Executive Director will send an email to congratulate the winner. An email will also be sent to all those who applied and were not chosen
- The public scholarship presentation will be made to the winner at the annual Together We Can Breakfast to be held on Thursday, March 16, 2017

How will the scholarship money be paid and to whom?

- The scholarship payout will be made directly to the college or university the winner will attend/is attending to be used for tuition, books and fees
- Payment will be planned with information received from the winner of the scholarship
